Keys to Menkes

If you think that credible underground cinema is a thing of the radical-chic past, a good, long look at Nina Menkes' work is in order. Good, long looks are her specialty, in fact; her meticulously observed and suggestively framed shots have drawn comparisons to Antonioni and Tarkovsky.

Her new film, Queen of Diamonds, is making the festival rounds, garnering good notices and be-wildered attention. Her last film, 1986's anguished Magdalena Viraga, was named "Rest Independent Film" by the L.A. Film Critics' Association.

Filmforum will present *Viraga* and the non-dailogue *The Great Sadness of Zohara* at LACE, Mon. April 8 at 8 p.m. Menkes, who teaches classes in film at USC and CalArts, will appear.
